



Hello. My name is... The peace of the Lord be with you!

These words characterize our first collaborative worship experience and picnic with our siblings at Faith Lutheran Church in Fairlawn on Sunday, August 4. More that 180 people gathered that day to step into an intentional collaboration in hopes of strengthening both congregations' common ministry in and through the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, specifically in the greater Akron area, in the spirit of the Isaiah 43 initiative in the Northeastern Ohio Synod.

Approximately 33 members of Holy Trinity (half of our average in person Sunday worship attendance) were on the receiving end of words of welcome and generous hospitality. The worship service featured an interactive children's message focusing on the proper way to pass the peace using the words: "Hello. My name is... The peace of the Lord be with you." The children then moved through the congregation, teaching the adults present how to engage in this act of worship extended towards one another. The Gospel Disciples in Song, a group of the Derbytown Chorus, shared several pieces of music throughout the service which ended with Holy Communion.

Feedback from Holy Trinity members who attended included the words: "wonderful," "uplifting," "renewing," "fun," and "when can we do this again?"


