



Since July, Holy Trinity Lutheran Church Akron and Faith Lutheran Church Fairlawn have been holding monthly collaborative events.

These collaborative events will end with "Midweek Devotions and Lunch" in November at Faith led by Rachel Nunez and the "Festival Lessons and Carols" concert in December at Holy Trinity — please see details on the previous page. The goal of this six-month series of events has been to strengthen both congregations' relationships with one another through intentional interaction.

The logical question is "What's next?" First though, please note what <u>is not planned</u>. The focus at this time is not on combining the two congregations; both will continue to maintain their buildings and to hold weekly worship services. What <u>is being discussed</u> is sharing staff – including pastoral staff – and ministry.

Later in November, the two Church Councils and a few other designated leaders from both congregations will meet with Pastor Jonathan Stufft, Assistant to the Bishop of the Northeastern Ohio Synod, for a "Visioning Session" to identify the opportunities and challenges an ongoing collaboration might hold. Depending on the feedback, "Listening Sessions" with/for other interested congregation members *may* be held in January and February 2025.

Participation by other ELCA congregations with Faith Lutheran Church and Holy Trinity Lutheran Church is not planned at this time, although that continues to be a future possibility.

In the meantime, you are invited to participate in and attend our final two collaborative events being held in November and December. †



Joyful Giving

My sense of what "giving" meant truly crystalized when I was a part of Crossways.

As we read and studied the Bible over the two years of the program, a key concept emerged for me. Not only did God create the Earth, he owns the Earth. The world is His—not ours, even if we have deeds or certificates of ownership.

Your house? His. Your car? His. Your bank account? His. Everything is on loan, although He shares it with us so graciously. So why do we hold on so tightly to everything that we think of as "ours"? We're human. And frail. And probably afraid of the "What ifs." But He is always with us. What do we have to fear?

While Jesus asked his disciples to leave everything behind, he doesn't ask that of us. He asks for us to love one another and to take care of one another. He suggests a tithe. And since I took that course, that is what I have done: tithed to the church, and then have given more as special appeals are made both by the church and in the community. For most of my adult life, I had been a faithful giver, but reading the Bible cover-to-cover in those two years, and then participating in other

Crossways classes spoke deeply to me about what it meant to be a Christian, to be a disciple of Jesus, to want to walk in His ways.

One of the reasons I joined Trinity more than a decade ago was because of its Outreach Programs. For me, seeing Trinity as a place where there were "believers in action" was pivotal in my decision. Words without action are empty, but Trinity has a myriad of programs that support our neighbors. And that's just as it should be.

That's what faithful giving does. Not only must a church's income "keep the lights on," it supports the things we need to do to "walk in His ways." Each of us can help. We need to provide resources to keep the church in good working order so that we can gather for worship and study here, as well as provide space for community groups. We also need to provide resources to some of those community groups in solidarity with the special groups they serve, like Habitat for Humanity.

To be a Christian is to say "Yes" to Jesus. Yes. I will feed those in need. Yes. I will help my neighbors in any and all ways I can. When I give to God first, I don't worry about spending money for other things because God receives my "first fruits." It is joyful giving and brings with it a peace which is hard to describe—but I would wish for you. †

God's Love Is Constant Even In the Midst of Change

I think about all those things, and I feel small and alone. But then I choose to remember God, and this is my hope: The Lord's faithful love never comes to an end. He never stops being kind to us. Every day, we can trust him to be kind again. We know that he will do what he has promised to do. He is my Lord,' I say to myself. 'He is the reason why I can hope for good things.' The Lord does good things for people who wait for him. He is kind to everyone who looks for him. It is good when people continue to hope. It is good when they quietly wait for the Lord, because he will save them."

(Lamentations 3:20-26)

Fall has arrived in Ohio bringing with it changing temperatures and variable skies. And I do mean variable. Any given day, this past week, you could look one direction and see white billowy clouds interspersed with patches of corn-blue sky, only to look another direction and see ominous, purple-gray clouds certain with rain.

The changing temperatures and skies are a reminder that we can never be sure what life is going to bring next. One minute the sun can be warming our face, and the next minute rain is pouring down on our head. Although we may not know what any given day may bring us, we can be sure that God will be there to hold us in that day. The circumstances of life are as variable as these recent fall skies have been, but God's love for us is – and always will be - constant.

In 1923, Thomas O. Chisholm wrote the lyrics that became the hymn "Great Is Thy Faithfulness." You likely know the first two verses and refrain by heart:

Great is thy faithfulness, O God our Father,
There is no shadow of turning with thee;
Thou changest not, thy compassions they fail not;
As thou hast been thou forever wilt be.

Great is thy faithfulness! Great is thy faithfulness! Morning by morning new mercies I see; All I have needed thy hand hath provided – Great is thy faithfulness, Lord unto me!

Summer and winter, and springtime and harvest, Sun, moon, and stars in their courses above Join with all nature in manifold witness To thy great faithfulness, mercy and love.

Have no doubt that God is faithful and that we can depend on God's love and care.

Merciful God, you know all things, see all things, and remember even the least of us. How good it is to know that your love and care, are constant, that we can depend on your presence with us in every season and situation life brings. Assure us of your faithfulness, grace, and mercy even when life is unpredictable and circumstances uncertain. Amen. †

Paragon Brass with Organ




Hearts for Music Performs


