Holy Trinity & Faith Lutheran Collaboration Update

As most of you know, our leadership has been in conversation with our counterparts at Faith Lutheran in Fairlawn, about ways our congregations might partner in ministry.

This conversation dovetails with Project Isaiah 43, an invitation from our synod leadership for us to consider the "new thing" God is doing. The hope is that collaboration - intentional partnerships between neighboring congregations - will support and strengthen them as they navigate the changes that have taken place in their ministry contexts.

The next step in this conversation is for the leaders from Holy Trinity and Faith to get input from more of their members. This will be done through small group "listening sessions" that will be offered both inperson and via Zoom. The "listening sessions" will focus on:

- 1. Stories that illustrate "why" Holy Trinity's ministry has been and remains important in our community,
- The opportunities and challenges facing our congregation as we move forward in ministry, and how a partnership with Faith might assist us in meeting those opportunities challenges.

A series of 'listening sessions' have been scheduled in early March. Each session will include 12-15 participants, a facilitator and a recorder. *NOTE:* You only need to attend one session.

- In-person Listening Sessions on Sunday, March 2 Four sessions will be held immediately after worship in these locations: Room 202, the Library, Chapel Lounge, and the Church Office (choose one to attend). Refreshments will be served in each location.
- Virtual Listening Session on Monday, March 3 An online session will be held via Zoom at 7:00 p.m. Anyone interested in attending should contact Pastor Becki to get the Zoom link.
- In-Person Listening Session on Wednesday, March 5 A final session will be held following the Ash Wednesday service at noon.
